

How to Finalize: Divorce with no minor children

If the other party doesn't respond after 21 days of service, finalize by default.

Go to courtsselfhelp.idaho.gov, under Divorce with no minor children and prepare the following forms:

- File the Affidavit of Service or Acknowledgment of Service
- Motion/Affidavit for Entry of Default
- Default
- Decree of Divorce (No Children)
- Vital Statistics Certificate of Divorce (obtained from Clerk)

When finalizing by default, your Decree of Divorce and Petition must match exactly!

Property & Debt Schedule: Do you have any property (separate, community personal or real property) under Section 2, 3, 4, or 5?

- Complete the Property & Debt Schedule and attach to your Decree of Divorce.
- Make sure the corresponding boxes for property on the proposed Decree of Divorce are checked.

If you and the other party are in agreement for the divorce, finalize by stipulation.

Go to courtsselfhelp.idaho.gov, under Divorce with no minor children and prepare the following forms:

- File the Affidavit of Service or Acknowledgment of Service
- Sworn Stipulation for Entry of Divorce Decree
- Decree of Divorce (No Children)
- Vital Statistics Certificate of Divorce (obtained from Clerk)

When finalizing by stipulation, both parties must sign the Stipulation for Entry of Divorce Decree

Property & Debt Schedule: Do you have any property (separate, community personal or real property) under Section 2, 3, 4, or 5?

- Complete the Property & Debt Schedule and attach to your Decree of Divorce.
- Make sure the corresponding boxes for property on the proposed Decree of Divorce are checked.
