

Resolution 2022-81
Surplus Property and Asset Deletion/Juvenile Detention

WHEREAS, *Idaho Code* §31-807 vests the Board of County Commissioners with the power and authority to manage real and personal property for the benefit of the County, and

WHEREAS, *Idaho Code* §31-829 provides that whenever any elected official has any personal property belonging to the county under his/her jurisdiction or control which, in his/her judgment, is of no further use to the county, he/she may, with the consent of the Board of County Commissioner, have the property declared as surplus and dispose of the property through sale or other means; and

WHEREAS, *Idaho Code* §31-808 provides that property not exceeding \$250.00 in value may be sold through a private sale without notice of public auction; and

WHEREAS, Kootenai County Juvenile Detention has on its Asset List one (1) Maytag Washer, Asset #6011, Serial No. 2000709TC; Model #MFR60PNCTS; one (1) Maytag Dryer, Asset #6014, Serial No. MDG75MNVWWZ8, Model #873815TJ; one (1) Maytag Washer, Asset #6012, Serial No. 22000702TC, Model #MFR60PNCTS and one (1) Maytag Dryer, Asset #6015, Serial No. 873089TJ, Model #MDG75MNVWW28 which are obsolete due to age, inoperable and not repairable, and/or are fully depreciated, and have therefore outlived their useful life and are of no further use to the County; and

WHEREAS, the estimated total value of the equipment is less than \$250.00; and

WHEREAS, Kootenai County Juvenile Detention desires to have the items referenced hereinabove declared surplus property, disposed of pursuant to law, and/or removed from the County's asset list;

NOW THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the items referenced in above be, and hereby are, declared to be surplus property, and in accordance therewith, the Board of County Commissioners may take action to dispose of said items in accordance with Idaho law, and remove the same from the County's list of assets.

Upon a motion to adopt the text of the foregoing Resolution made by Commissioner Fillios, seconded by Commissioner Brooks, the following vote was recorded:


