

RESOLUTION NO. 2010-65
OFFICE OF EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT - SURPLUS PROPERTY

WHEREAS, Idaho Code §31-807 vests the Board of County Commissioners with the power and authority to manage real and personal property for the benefit of the County; and

WHEREAS, Idaho Code §31-829 provides that whenever any elected official has any personal property belonging to the county under his/her jurisdiction or control which, in his/her judgment, is of no further use to the county, he/she may, with the consent of the Board of County Commissioners, have the property declared as surplus and dispose of the property through sale or other means; and,

WHEREAS, the Kootenai County Office of Emergency Management (OEM) has in its possession 271 wool blankets and 52 pillows which have accumulated and/or been acquired for use in emergency situations, however, the OEM has not been involved in an emergency situation over a period of at least the last ten (10) years which required the use of these items of property; and,

WHEREAS, due to storage space limitations, OEM has stored the property items in various locations on and off the county campus; and,

WHEREAS, the property items have a value of less than \$250.00, or are of no value whatsoever, and therefore would only take up valuable storage space if retained by OEM; and,

WHEREAS, the County has notified other county departments regarding the availability of the property items, and has received interest in, or request for, the transfer of said items of property – Veterans Services is requesting 10 blankets and 10 pillows; the Assessor's Office is requesting 20 blankets and OEM will retain 20 blankets and 20 pillows for use in the EOC during an emergency, leaving 221 and 22 pillows remaining; and,

WHEREAS, OEM desires to have the property items declared as surplus property, so that the items may be sold through auction or donated and transferred to another governmental agency.

NOW THEREFORE, it is hereby resolved that the property items referenced hereinabove be, and hereby are, declared to be surplus property, and, in accordance therewith, the Board of County Commissioners may take action to dispose of such property pursuant to Idaho law, either through donation to another governmental agency, or through private sale.

Upon a motion to adopt the text of the foregoing Resolution made by Commissioner Piazza, seconded by Commissioner Currie, the following vote was recorded:
